Club Member Requirements

- **Annual membership dues** of \$50 must be paid by the March General Club Meeting.
- **Attendance:** Members should attend at least 5 General Meetings per year.
- **Standing Committee:** Each member will serve on at least one Standing Committee; committee details are listed below.
- **Duncan Hines Festival:** Each member is required to adopt a number of ducks to friends and family, as well as volunteer their time at the Festival.
- **Winter fundraiser:** Each member is required to donate \$25, an item with an equivalent value, or recruit participants for the event.

Club Fundraiser Details

The Duncan Hines Festival has been presented by the Junior Woman's Club over 20 years and proceeds from the events benefit local non-profits. The Festival consists of the BG Brownie Eating Championship, Uncle Duncan's Duck Derby, silent auction, vendor booths, and other surprises!

Standing Committees

Community Service: The Community Service committee is responsible for the annual Coats for Kids event and the Community Improvement Project. This committee will promote and seek out volunteer activities to support women, children, and families in the community.

Development: The Development committee works to strengthen Club connections with the community, brand name and membership. This committee will be responsible for advertising Club activities, interests, and volunteer work to the community through use of various media. The Development committee will recommend and publish changes to bylaws and member yearbook.

Membership: This committee is responsible for recruiting new members, retaining existing members and obtaining Club contacts by attending various community events and utilizing social media; the committee will also recognize and reward club members, schedule monthly general meetings and guest speakers, schedule social events, and attend functions in the community.

Special Events - The Special Events committee is responsible for planning fundraisers throughout the year to raise funds for the Club. This committee shall also secure sponsorships and maintain a master list of donors.

The Coats for Kids Campaign is a community-wide effort to collect new and gently used coats for those in need. The Club also collects monetary donations to purchase new coats for children. All donations are distributed to those in need in the community.

The Cheers to New Year's 5K is a New Year's Day foot race held at Lover's Lane Park. Participants in the race enjoy plenty of goodies such as a t-shirt, coffee, fruit, and other snacks. A portion of the proceeds from this event benefits our annually appointed Community Improvement Project.
